WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF Washington Motorcycle Safety Program (WMSP) Examiner and Instructor Professional Standards

The Professional standards for WMSP examiners and instructors were created to ensure that motorcycle rider education and endorsement/permit tests are presented and conducted in a consistent, effective, and professional manner according to DOL standards outlined here.

Examiners and instructors for DOL shall: Proficiency

- Meet the proficiency standards set by DOL.
- Conduct testing and training following DOL protocols.

Scope of Practice

- Not counsel, refer, give advice, or express personal opinions to individuals they are testing or training.
- Not engage in any other activities that may be construed to constitute a service other than providing DOL services during testing and training.

Non-discrimination

- Always be neutral, impartial, and unbiased.
- Not deny or exclude any person from any program, activity, or facility based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, income level, or English proficiency level.
- Contact WMSP immediately for further guidance if unable to ethically perform in any situation.

Compensation

- Not receive any gifts, compensation, or benefits from customers for services rendered, except as allowed under the provisions of contract.
- Not use DOL's influence, equipment, facilities, or supplies for the gain or advantage of themselves or others.
- Not use, or attempt to use, their position to secure privileges or exemptions from DOL.

Professional Development

· Maintain awareness of updates related to testing and training standards, laws, rights, and confidentialities.

Impartiality/Conflict of Interest

- Disclose any real or perceived conflict of interest which could/would affect objectivity.
- Not administer testing or training to family members or close personal friends, which violates the test taker's
 rights to confidentiality and creates a conflict of interest.

Professional Demeanor

- Maintain professional behavior, written and verbal language, and interaction with others.
- Treat all Students and Participants as DOL customers when conducting License Endorsement Training and Testing services.
- Will communicate and interact with others in a manner that is free of intimidation, harassment or threat, and is consistent with the interests of DOL and testing/instructing safety.

Integrity

- · Report any fraudulent activities to WMSP.
- Ensure document integrity and security by limiting access to tests and forms.
- Use only approved and most current versions of DOL license endorsement tests and forms.
- Ensure collection of all tests and forms when testing is complete.

Examiners will specifically:

- · Verify each test taker by photo identification.
- · Ensure test takers did not view the test prior to taking.
- · Maintain a positive and secured test environment:
- Temperature, ventilation, lighting, non-testing interference or traffic, etc.
- Ensure that test takers are seated and positioned to limit view of other's test answers.
- Ensure that all books, notes and study materials, phones, cameras, bags and purses, etc. are secured or removed from testing area.
 - Take appropriate steps to prevent knowledge test compromise or loss.
 - Not allowing tests, answer sheets, or graded score sheets to be taken or photographed.
- Immediately notify the Contractor and WMSP if a test is lost, taken, or photographed.
- Ensure test takers are monitored at all times by being in the same room.
- Administer tests to DOL standards in accordance with WMSP policies and procedures.
- Offer verbal tests for customers who have trouble communicating or reading such as illiteracy, dyslexia, or other reasons.
- · Ensure interpreters are observed.
- Ensure test results are scored and documented accurately to DOL standards in accordance with WMSP
 policies and procedures and Contractor protocols.
- Debrief results, options, and appropriate license endorsement/permit requirements.

Instructors will specifically:

- Teach the minimum required courses per year as required by RCW 46.81A.020.
- Maintain a current and valid driver license, motorcycle endorsement, and satisfactory driving record as required by DOL.
- Maintain certification in at least one WMSP approved curriculum.
- Maintain current First Aid certification, which will be kept on file by sponsoring contractor.
